HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

Shown below is the general program. However, Coordinated Care Alliance programs can be customized to your practice's needs.



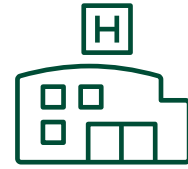
Referring provider meets with patient and determines if program is appropriate based upon the patient's individual needs.



CTCA coordinates appointment scheduling, travel logistics and overnight accommodations directly with the patient.*



At the end of the evaluation, the patient, CTCA oncologist and referring provider discuss and implement a treatment plan together.



Patient completes in-office visits at CTCA Chicago as appropriate during treatment.

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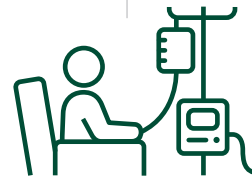
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Referring provider's office submits medical records, including imaging and pathology reports, directly to the CTCA® oncologist.



Patient evaluated at the CTCA Chicago Comprehensive Care and Research Center in Zion, Illinois, which may include additional testing to aide in determining a treatment plan.



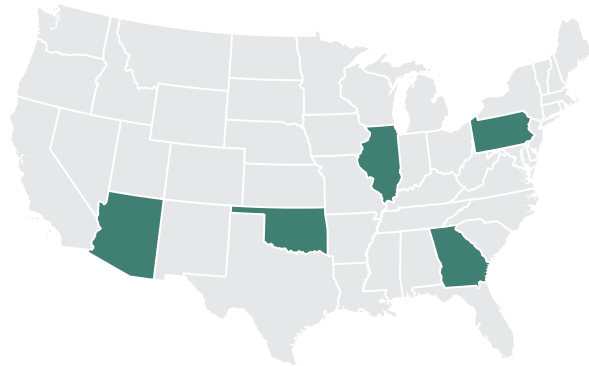
Upon returning home, the patient attends regular appointments at the referring provider's office. Referring provider and CTCA oncologist communicate regularly to discuss treatment status and next steps. Depending upon availability, chemotherapy and radiation may be completed at the referring provider's location.



Upon treatment completion, CTCA oncology team are available for follow up consultations as needed, transitioning the patient back fully into the care of the referring provider.

*CTCA may offer travel assistance to patients to help reduce patient barriers to care. CTCA is not legally permitted to provide transportation for beneficiaries of government health insurance programs, such as Medicare.
